Bean Bag Cube



Fabric requirements

- 1 1/4 yards Silky Fleece Fabric
- 1 3/4 yards 45" wide muslin

Material Requirements

- Thread to match fabric
- Topstitching thread for muslin cube
- 1 bag Poly-fil® Bean Bag Filler
- 18" zipper

Tools

- Sewing machine
- scissors, ruler and fabric marking pencil
- needle and pins
- Optional: rotary cutter, mat and ruler

Directions

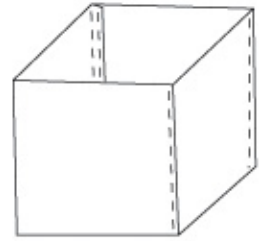
Sew all seams right sides together using 1/2" seam allowance. Topstitch seams on muslin cube only.

- 1) Cut six 20" squares from each silky fleece and muslin. You will be making a muslin beanbag to hold the beanbag filler and a silky fleece cover.
- 2) Stitch four pieces together beginning 1/2" from top and ending 1/2" from bottom. Make sure to match the nap of the fabric on all silky fleece pieces so it smooths from top to bottom.
- 3) On Muslin, finger press seam allowance to one side and topstitch 1/4" from seam beginning 1/2" from top and ending 1/2" from bottom.
- 4) Join the first square to the last square in the same

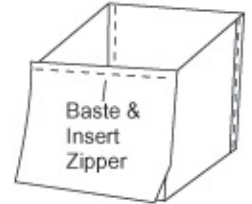


manner and topstitch.

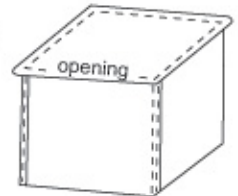
- 5) On silky fleece cube, pin one edge of bottom to one lower side edge. Mark 1" in from side edges. Stitch from corner to mark, baste between marks and stitch remainder of seam. Insert zipper in seam between marks.



- 6) Stitch the remaining sides of the bottom to the lower edges of sides. Press seam allowance toward sides and topstitch 1/4" from seam.



- 7) On muslin cube, pin edges of bottom to lower edge of sides. Stitch all sides leaving an opening for turning. On muslin, press seam allowance toward sides and topstitch 1/4" from seam.



- 8) Stitch top to sides omitting zipper and opening. Finger press seam allowance to one side and topstitch 1/4" from seam.

- 9) Insert muslin cube into fabric cube. Following instructions on bag of Bean Bag Filler, insert filler into muslin cube. Securely slipstitch opening and zip the silky fleece shell.



You may use the cube as an ottoman or add a tray and it becomes a side table.
